Everett H. Dardani, 59, of Third Street, Shore Acres, died Dec. 29 at South County Hospital.

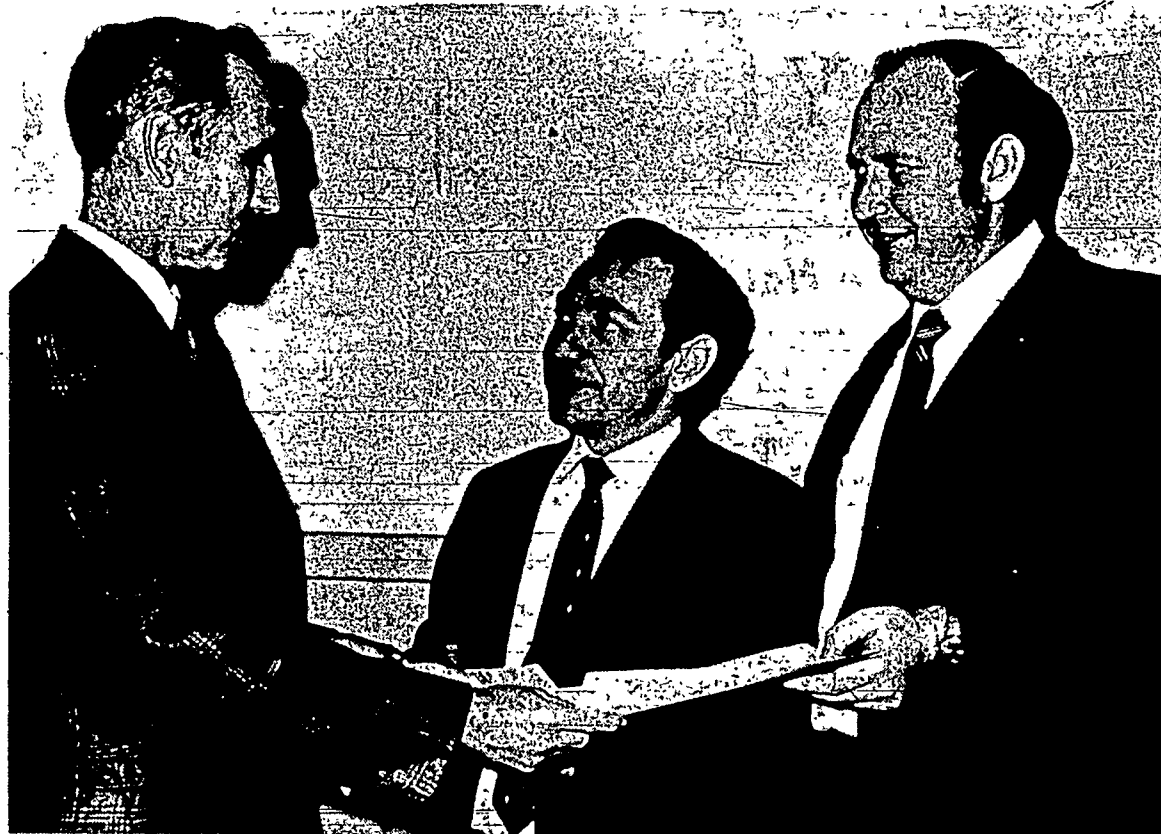
Before his illness several months ago he was employed as preservation mechanic at the Davisville Seabee Center. He served in the Army during World War II.

Mr. Dardani was born in Brooklyn, N.Y. Sept. 12, 1911. He was the son of Caesar Dardani of Bridgeport, Conn., and the late Louise (Paganuzzi) Dardani.

Besides his father he leaves a brother, Louis, of Howard Beach, N.Y.

Funeral services were held Jan. 2 in Bridgeport, with a requiem Mass celebrated at the Church of Our Lady of Good Council in that city. Burial was in Mountain Grove Cemetery, Bridgeport.

A memorial Mass will be held at the Chapel-in-the-Pines at the Davisville Seabee Center Monday, Jan. 11, at noon.

Burned horse making 'satisfactory progress'

The small Indian buckskin horse which was burned last week by vandals is making satisfactory progress in recovering from the ordeal, Mrs. Dorothy Shread, mother of 13-year-old Darlene Shread owner of the horse, said yesterday.

"The horse is coming along beautifully, health wise," Mrs. Shread said. "After the hair grows out and the burns are healed we are hoping it will be the same horse it was before the fire," she added.

Kiowa the pet horse of the Shread family of 32 Nicholas Road was set afire on Dec. 28 when vandals poured kerosene on the horse. The horse suffered burns from its mane to its tail and down its right side. The ears were charred and one eye swelled. But the horse responded to treatment and is now, according to Mrs. Shread, doing "beautifully."

"Baring, no complications we believe the horse will be the same as before. I just can't believe the recovery it made," she said.

Mrs. Shread said she and her daughter appreciate the hundreds of calls and letters received from people concerned about the condition of the horse. "There are so

many wonderful people who have contacted us," she remarked.

Shortly after news broke on the incident Darlene received a \$500 check from an anonymous Johnston man who offered the money for use in buying a new horse if Kiowa died. The Rhode Island Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals offered a \$100 reward for the arrest and conviction of the person or persons responsible for the incident. Since then the reward money increased substantially.

North Kingstown detectives and the SPCA are continuing their investigation.
